ELAINE F. MARSHALL

NC Secretary of State

In 1996, Secretary of State Elaine F. Marshall became the first woman ever elected to a statewide, executive branch office in North Carolina. Voters re-elected her to a seventh term in 2020. A former teacher, small business owner, and private practice attorney, Secretary Marshall was elected to the NC Senate before rising to statewide office.

Under Secretary Marshall's administration, more than 1.7 million businesses have been formed. She has pioneered e-commerce in government, protected investors and intellectual property owners, and promoted financial capital formation in North Carolina.

Secretary Marshall has been very active in many civic groups in the areas of child welfare, women's issues, and agriculture and small town economic development. She credits 4-H as an important part of her youth and received Lifetime Achievement Awards from North Carolina 4-H and in 2014 was inducted into the National 4-H Hall of Fame .

She holds a B.S. in Home Economics from the University of Maryland and a law degree from Campbell University. She has received Honorary Doctorate Degrees from Campbell University, Lees-McRae College, Meredith College and the Republic of Moldova State University of Medicine. Since becoming Secretary of State, Secretary Marshall has received numerous state and national awards for leadership in technology, government innovation, and women's leadership.

She is married to Jessie Thomas Bunn.

RICHARD G. SNEED

Principal Chief, Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians

Richard G. Sneed life's work has been one of public service advocating for youth, community building, and cultural preservation. The son of a businessman and former council member, he knows that hard work and a community-centered focus enable collective opportunity. In this vein, he has worked throughout his career to ensure that Cherokee people have equitable access to quality education.

Having grown up in Wolftown, on the Qualla Boundary, he values being rooted in a community that honors family, culture, and progressive thinking. After graduating from Cherokee High School in 1986, Richard Sneed served in the United States Marine Corp for four years. Father of five children, Breanna, Richie, Mattilynn, Katrina and Samuel, Sneed earned his degree from Universal Technical College in Phoenix, AZ, and holds a North Carolina Teaching License in Industrial Arts.

In 2015, Sneed was called to formalize his commitment to public service and was elected Vice Chief of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI). On May 25, 2017, he was officially sworn in as Principal Chief of the Eastern Band and subsequently re-elected as Principal Chief on September 5th, 2019.

Chief Sneed's administration is dedicated to exercising the EBCI's sovereignty, including growing relationships and partnerships, in part, through his service to the WCU Cherokee Center Advisory Board, United South and Eastern Tribes (USET), and the Cherokee Preservation Foundation Board of Directors. Chief Sneed has recently been elected as the Vice-Chairman of the Center for Disease Control's Tribal Advisory Committee.



TIFFANY HENRY

Director of Economic Development, Jackson County

Tiffany Henry is the Director of Economic Development for Jackson County. In this role Tiffany works with many businesses, providing them with information, tools and support to locate and expand in Jackson County. Tiffany is a dynamic, team-spirited, results-oriented professional with a goal of providing clients with the tools they need to be sustainable and successful. Tiffany was previously the Director of Southwestern Community College's Small Business Center, an organization focused on increasing business success. Over those eight years she assisted with the startup of over 165 businesses with the creation of more than 1,260 jobs and the retention of over 1,100 jobs throughout Jackson, Macon and Swain Counties.

Tiffany is a proud, born-and-raised Jackson County native and Western Carolina University Catamount, holding her bachelor's degree in Business Administration and Law. Director, Mountain West Partnership

The Mountain West Partnership is currently led by Josh Carpenter, who has a strong background in economic development. Before he started as Director at MWP, Josh served as Economic Development Director in Cherokee County (four years), Planner and Economic Development Director for Graham County (two years), and most recently as Existing Industry Expansion Manager at the Economic Development Partnership of North Carolina. Over his six years at EDPNC, Josh supported new and existing businesses as they expanded into Western North Carolina. In this capacity he was partially responsible for the creation of 1,800 jobs and close to \$600 million in new investments.



RICH PRICE

Executive Director of Economic Development and Regional Partnerships, Western Carolina University

Rich Price was named as Executive Director of Economic Development and Regional Partnerships at Western Carolina University in March of 2021, after serving as Director of Economic Development for Jackson County, NC for the previous seven years (2013–2020). During his tenure with WCU he has also served in the interim role of Chief Marketing and Communications Officer. Mr. Price's primary responsibilities are connecting WCU to economic development opportunities and matters across the State of North Carolina, and specifically within the Western portion of the State, ensuring that his alma mater has a prominent seat at the table to create economic well-being.

In addition to his current role, Rich also serves as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Mountain West NC partnership, a regional collaboration of Economic Developers and Educational Leaders representing the seven western-most counties in North Carolina and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians. He also serves as a member of the Executive Committee of the Southwestern Workforce Development Board, and as a member of both the EDPNC Advisory Council, and the UNC System Economic Transformation Council. Rich is an alumnus of Western Carolina University where he received his Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration in 1988, with dual concentrations is both management and marketing. He and his wife Susan reside in the Whittier community in Northern Jackson County.



RUSS HARRIS

Executive Director, Southwestern Commission

Russ Harris is the Executive Director of the Southwestern Commission. The Southwestern Commission is the regional council of governments for the seven western counties in North Carolina, the towns within those counties, and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians. The Southwestern Commission seeks to improve the quality of life in the region. This is accomplished through the work of its three departments which are the Area Agency on Aging, Workforce Development, and Community and Economic Development. Prior to becoming the Executive Director in 2021, he served as the Director of Community and Economic Development of the Southwestern Commission for five years. During his time with the Southwestern Commission, he has focused on expanding broadband access and addressing the region's housing shortage.

A Tribal citizen of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI), Jeremy Hyatt grew up in the Birdtown Community of Cherokee, NC and now resides in the Little Savannah community of Jackson County with his wife, Manu.

After earning a BS in Anthropology from Western Carolina University in 2000 he moved to Durango, Colorado where he directed resort outdoor adventure programming and guest services for multiple properties. Upon his return to WNC, Hyatt was recruited to participate in the Cherokee Development Program through Harrah's Cherokee Casino where he worked as a departmental manager until 2009. He then served as Governmental Affairs Liaison for the Office of the Principal Chief. In 2013, he was named Director of Natural Resources and Construction, overseeing environmentally sustainable development for the EBCI. In 2015, Hyatt was promoted to his current position as Secretary of Operations, which expanded his oversight responsibilities to include many of the EBCI's utilities and Public Safety programs. Hyatt is an active Board Member of the Cherokee Historical Association and the Growing Outdoors Partnership. Most recently, his passion for the outdoors led him to spearhead the development of the Fire Mountain Trails, which opened in 2017. This project is heralded as one of the Southeast's premier mountain biking and hiking trail systems and foremost examples of environmentally sustainable economic development for tribal nations. Hyatt is a vocal advocate for strong regional partnerships, infrastructure modernization, eco-tourism and small business.
